THE FUNDAMENTALS OF **ROTARY**

The fundamentals of Rotary create more or less a type of circular reference...from Rotary International to districts to local clubs there is an importance to basic tenets that belong to individuals at every level of Rotary. The Chatham Rotary Club was organized in March 1939. Around one hundred persons attended Charter Night, which was held at Chatham Hall. The Danville Club, represented by Curtis Bishop and Bascorn Jordan, sponsored our Club. Ed Brush, business manager at Chatham Hall, was elected the first president by thirteen men who signed the charter.

From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is The 4-Way Test, which was created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor (who later served as RI president) when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. This 24-word code of ethics for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The 4-Way Test has been translated into more than a hundred languages and published in thousands of ways.

Herb Taylor insisted there is a lot of good in everybody, but too often we look only for the bad. The Four Way Test encourages the good in the person who uses it. It helps people to think right and to think things through before they speak or act. The four Way Test started in an office in the days of the Great Depression as the result of a prayer for help to preserve the jobs of 250 people. Through Rotary International, it spread around the world. It has influenced thoughts, words and actions of countless people, and through them, even government and world events. It is a test for all time and for all people. Try using it on the next decision you face.

Adopt A Highway

Background/History of Project:

The Chatham Rotary Club sponsored a stretch of Rt. 57 for 10+ years. Eventually, VDOT took it over, so as a club, we decided to continue cleanup of local roads in our vicinity.

Project Overview:

Twice a year, spring and fall, members collect trash and debris along our designated adopted roadway, Anderson Mill Rd, Chatham VA.

As we strive to give back to our community, these kinds of hands-on projects show our willingness to get involved in the upkeep and promotion of our local assets, making it safer for wildlife, and more attractive for our community. We also invite community members and volunteers to participate with us.

Impact Statement:

“This program is a key strategy in maintaining a positive travel experience for residents and visitors, and in preventing litter from entering local waterways.” (VDOT)



Annual Christmas Parade

Project Overview: Each year, the club participates in the Annual Chatham Christmas parade as a method to get involved in community celebrations. The parade features First Responders, local high schools band, floats, treats and various distributions. We also invite community members and volunteers to participate with us.



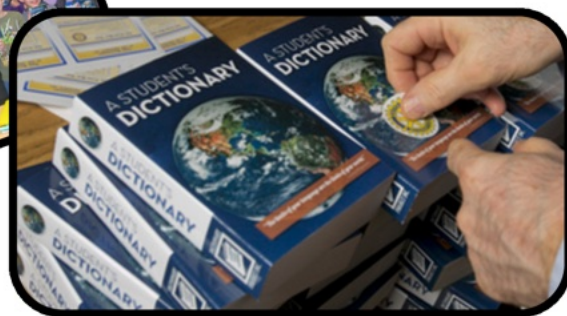
Impact Statement: Drive visitation to Chatham, VA through holiday parade, positive and significant economic impact on local business activity.



The Dictionary Project

Project Overview:

Chatham Rotary Club members purchase and distribute dictionaries to over 200 children in the third grade at all the elementary schools in Pittsylvania County each year.



Impact Statement:

Introduce Rotary mission and values. Inspire love of reading and learning at a critical time in the development of young people's minds, resulting in a positive impact on reading comprehension.

Easter Basket Distribution

Background/History of Project:

Over four years of service to the 80+ residents of the Chatham Nursing and Rehabilitation Center.

Project Overview:

Club members filled baskets with edibles, toiletries and other goods for older adults. Club Members then delivered the items to the residents and spent time visiting.

Impact Statement:

"Gift baskets help residents remain cognitively sharp, reduce stress and benefit mental health."





Harris Field Playground

The Chatham Rotary Club has raised \$13,138 through the Club, District and Community Grants to improve the Harris Field Playground in Chatham VA. Harris Field is a high use outdoor sports complex that includes two little league baseball fields, a walking trail, pickle ball courts, bathrooms, concessions, paved parking and the playground. The playground does not currently have swing sets. These monies will allow for matching swing sets to be purchased and installed. Of particular note is that they will include two swings for special needs children. Additionally, the playground will be cleaned and mulch refreshed. Work will be completed in time for families to enjoy starting in the Spring of 2026. (Pictures are designers renderings)





God's Storehouse

Project Overview:

God's Storehouse works throughout the Danville and Pittsylvania County communities to collect food, distribute food resources to those in need, promote nutrition and connect customers to local resources.

Impact Statement: Chatham Rotary Club partners quarterly with God's Storehouse and Kentuck Baptist Church to help pack food that will be distributed, providing nutrition to families in need to prevent hunger, reduce food insecurity and improve local food systems in our area. We reach approximately 40 families, 200 individuals.



Holiday Toy Drive

Background/History of Project:

Our club has had multiple years of partnering annually with Social Services to provide gifts for families in the Foster Care program.

Project Overview:

Member donations provide gifts for families participating in the Foster Care program. The Foster Care program assures that children from participating Foster families receive a gift.

Impact Statement:

Providing gifts has a healing power of play for children of foster care to reduce stress and benefit mental health, making a positive impact and providing something tangible to inspire hope during the holiday season. Toys deliver physical, emotional and educational benefits. Winter outerwear and accessories contribute to the overall health of children.





Hometown Heroes 4th of July Celebration

Project Overview:

A weekend of celebration and family fun is what this project is all about! Parades, fireworks, great food and more bring the community together to celebrate the 4th of July!

Impact Statement:

Drive visitation to Chatham, VA through holiday parade, positive and significant economic impact on local business activity. Our annual Community festival reaches 1,000 - 2,000 attendees each year!



Field of Honor

Background/History of Project

As part of the Fourth of July Festivities the Chatham Rotary Club sponsors this great ceremony to honor our heroes!

Project Overview

As part of the Hometown Heroes July Fourth of July celebration for 2025, Chatham Rotary Club presents the Field of Honor, located in a field beside the Olde Dominion Agricultural Center (ODAC) the display features an array of approximately 350 American flags.



Impact Statement

The Field is located beside a traveled highway (US 29) and inspires tourists traveling, as well as the local community during the month revolving around July 4th.





Interact Club

Background/History of Project:

Interact programs help younger leaders build leadership skills, expand education and learn the value of service.

Interact clubs bring together young people ages 12-18 to develop leadership skills while discovering the power of Service Above Self.



Project Overview:

Interact clubs organize at least two projects every year, one that helps their school or community and one that promotes international understanding. Rotary club sponsors mentor and guide Interact Club youth as they carry out projects and develop leadership skills.

Impact Statement:

Opportunity for engagement of youth and introduction to the mission of Rotarian life.

Northern Pittsylvania County Food Center

Project Overview:

The Northern Pittsylvania County Food Center serves Pittsylvania County from Tightsqueeze to the Campbell County line. The distribution focuses on low and fixed income families in northern Pittsylvania County by delivering monthly food boxes.

Impact Statement:

Volunteers pack and distribute food to nourish neighbors and develop solutions to address food insecurity.

\$10,000 ANNUAL DONATION FUND

The Chatham Rotary Club \$10,000 Annual Donations Fund, was established to provide ongoing support to other community organization initiatives. 2024 - 2025 Recipients

Chatham Rotary Club Scholarship Fund

Each year two \$1,000 scholarships are awarded to a deserving student from Chatham High School and one from Gretna High School to assist with the costs of college or university. This fund is managed and administered by the Community Foundation of the Dan River Region.



Chatham Rotary Foundation

The Chatham Rotary Foundation was set up as the 501(c)(3) for the Chatham Rotary Club. The Foundation was created to support the ideals of Rotary, primarily to benefit organizations and projects that enhance the betterment of the community of Chatham and the surrounding area. The Foundation is the primary recipient of grants for, and the administration of, the Reimagine Chatham Initiative.



Rotary Youth Leadership Awards
